Scripture Reflection

Today's readings center on the experience of prayer. We sing and speak in prayer and we pray silently. We offer prayers of petition, praise, and thanksgiving. Prayer is our conversation with God. When we pray, and what we say when we pray, says a lot about who we are and who we think God is. In Sirach we hear that "the prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds." It is not that the lowly and the poor are closer to God by being poor and lowly, it is that they turn to God and not into themselves.

In the Gospel the Pharisee has lived a virtuous life, doing more than the Law requires of a devout person. The tax collector was, by reputation and practice, despised and fraudulent, and he readily admits he is a sinner. The conclusion of the parable reverses the expectations of Jesus' audience. The Pharisee turns inward and does not seek anything from God; it appears that he only wants God to hear him report on all the pious things he has done. His put-down of the tax collector is intended to make himself even better in the eyes of God. The favor Jesus gives to the tax collector rests on his turning outward to God, who alone can be merciful and lead him to a transformed life.

The parable is not about disagreeing on points of religious teaching or practice; it is about becoming humble before God and recognizing the dignity of other human beings, especially those with whom we disagree and whom we are so willing to treat with scorn. Perhaps there is a little of the Pharisee in each of us; we can so easily be judgmental. We might well boast of our good deeds. And we are also like the tax collector when we are honest and humble. The Lord hears the cry of all of us; our prayers pierce the clouds seeking the mercy of God.

 Consider your own faith and your relationship to God. When have you considered yourself spiritually superior to others? How have you been able to see God's mercy active in your life and the lives of others?

There is a need for additional ministers at our weekly Sunday liturgies. Cathedral Masses are scheduled every Saturday at 5:00 PM, and on Sunday at 8:00 AM, 10:00 AM, Noon, and 5:00 PM. Your stewardship of time and talent will greatly serve the needs of our Parish.

These are the various opportunities available to you and your family.

Ushers: These are men and women who extend hospitality to all; are available for emergencies; help take up the collection; and give bulletins at the end of Mass.

Altar Servers: Children (fourth grade and up) and adults who assist the priest at Mass. Servers process in and out with cross and candles; light the candles; hold the Roman Missal: dress and undress the altar: and help with the preparation of the gifts.

Readers: Adults and youth, male and female, who proclaim the first and second reading at Mass. Your ability to proclaim God's revealed Word nourishes all gathered for worship.

Choir: Men, women, and youth volunteer their voices in praise of God. Choir rehearsals are every Thursday evening. The choir regularly sings at the Sunday 10:00 AM Mass and at special diocesan events.

Cantors: Men, women, and youth who lead the assembly in song, giving praise and thanks to God. Cantors are song leaders who invite all gathered to fully participate in the Mass.

Commentators: Men, women, and youth who pray the Universal Prayer (General Intercessions) following the Creed at Mass. This ministry voices the petitions of the Church.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion: Fully initiated Catholics who have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist help distribute the consecrated elements of Bread and Wine to the assembly. These ministers help give the Body and Blood of Christ in the absence of the ordained priest and deacon.

Prayerfully consider your possible call to serve in any of these ministries. You may choose more than one liturgical ministry. The Parish Liturgy Committee decided not to have the usual fall workshop for all ministries, but rather to meet individually with each ministry. Before those meetings are scheduled, there is a need for additional volunteers to come forward and offer vour time and talent.
