Scripture Reflection

The psalmist's proclamation, "The Lord hears the cry of the poor" reflects the message of today's readings. The Book of Sirach expresses the fundamental Israelite understanding that God champions the oppressed, the poor, the widow, the orphan, and the lowly. Their prayer "pierces the cloud."

From his prison cell, Paul writes to his fellow missionary Timothy as he foresees his imminent death. Looking back over his life, he expresses with conviction his trust in the Lord's love and mercy: "I have finished the race; I have kept the faith. From now on the crown of righteousness awaits me."

The parable in the Gospel is one of Jesus' most concise and forceful. Luke conveys its purpose in the introduction, "Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else." The prayer of the Pharisee expresses this attitude. In fact, the Pharisee was not praying to God, he was talking to himself as he listed all his great virtues. He considered himself to be better than the rest of humanity. Contrasted to the Pharisees, is the tax collector, one of the most despised members of society. In his encounter with God, he recognized his unworthiness by uttering the simple prayer, "O God, be merciful to me a sinner."

Luke captures the parable's message succinctly in Jesus' ending, "whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

The humble person, as all the readings illustrate, is the one who acknowledges that all is grace. Everything comes from God. In our encounter with God, we recognize our sinfulness and needs of God's forgiveness.
